

LAWRENCE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MEETING – May 22, 2018 page-1

Chairman Brandon Flanagan called the regular meeting of the Lawrence County Commissioners to order and the Pledge of Allegiance was conducted at 8:00 a.m. on May 22, 2018 in the Administrative Annex Building of the Lawrence County Courthouse located at 90 Sherman Street, Deadwood, SD with Commissioners Randy Deibert, Daryl Johnson and Richard Sleep. Randall Rosenau absent.

All motions were passed by unanimous vote, by all members present, unless stated otherwise.

BRIDGE IMPROVEMENT GRANT (B.I.G.) UPDATE: Jason Hanson, Brosz Engineering, was present to discuss design for the bridge replacement on Whitewood Valley Road over Whitewood Creek #SN 41-212-091. Moved-Seconded (Johnson-Flanagan) to authorize the Chairman to sign an agreement with Brosz Engineering to prepare a bid ready design for the bridge replacement on Whitewood Valley Road over Whitewood Creek #SN 41-212-091. Motion Carried.

HOMESTAKE ROAD BRIDGE: Allan Bonnema, Highway Superintendent informed the Board that the wood planks have been replaced on the Homestake Road bridge.

PLANNING & ZONING:

CHANGE OF ZONING #322/NELSON: First Reading and a Public Hearing was held on COZ #322 APPLICANT: Terry Nelson SUMMARY: PF to HSC LEGAL: Tract 2B in Section 25, T4N, R3E VICINITY LOCATION: Highway 385 and Brownsville Road. Dennis Anderson, 21554 Buffalo Lane, Deadwood SD 57732, spoke against the change of zoning. He stated his concern for safety at an already busy intersection, rural setting, emergency traffic from the fire department and flood plain issues. Terry Nelson, 7608 Bluebird Lane, Black Hawk SD 57718, Applicant, gave a background of his business experience. He stated that he did not object to Planning & Zoning's decision to split the property into two classifications. No other public input was voiced and the hearing was closed. Commissioner Flanagan stated his concerns were access onto the Brownsville Road and flood plain. Commissioner Sleep stated he doesn't feel that the entirety of the property should be changed as it would detrimentally affect the dynamics of the area. Commissioner Johnson stated his concern was the potential for businesses offering off-road vehicle rental and/or a campground, and that either of these types of businesses would compound existing issues concerning off-road vehicle traffic. Second reading scheduled for June 12, 2018.

ORDINANCE #18-02/WILSON: First Reading and a Public Hearing was held on proposed ORD #18-02. APPLICANT: David Wilson SUMMARY: Add taxi business as an Allowed Use in SRD VICINITY LOCATION: Highway 14A (Spearfish) No public input was voiced and the public hearing was closed. David Wilson, applicant stated that there will be no activity on the property except for the employee's picking up their vehicles. He also commented that the neighbors who attended the Planning and Zoning meeting were mostly curious with how business activities would be conducted on the property. Commissioner Sleep stated that he did not feel this type of business is appropriate in a residential area. Second reading scheduled for June 12, 2018.

BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT COOPERATING AGENCY STATUS: Chip Kimball, Field Manager was present to discuss the agency's current projects, and the topic of cooperating agency status with Lawrence County.

ABATEMENTS:

CITY OF SPEARFISH: Moved-Seconded (Deibert-Flanagan) to approve the abatement for the City of Spearfish on parcel #32680-00800-010-00 because the property is tax exempt. Motion Carried.

CITY OF SPEARFISH: Moved-Seconded (Deibert-Flanagan) to approve the abatement for the City of Spearfish on parcel #32630-00800-030-00 because the property is tax exempt. Motion Carried.

LSBENNETT PROPERTIES LLC: Moved-Seconded (Sleep-Flanagan) to approve the abatement for the LSBennett Properties LLC on parcel #27300-00096-000-10 because the property was assessed for more acreage than existed. Motion Carried.

SURPLUS PROPERTY / CITY OF SPEARFISH: Moved-Seconded (Deibert-Flanagan) to declare the following real property as surplus property, authorize the transfer of the property to City of Spearfish, and allow the Chairman to sign the Deed. Legal Description: Part of Lot 1 Block 8 in the revised golden belt addition to the City of Spearfish, Lawrence County, South Dakota. Subject to covenants, restrictions, rights-of-way, and easements of record, if any; and Part of Lot 2 and 3 in the revised golden belt addition to the City of Spearfish, Lawrence County, South Dakota. Subject to covenants, restrictions, rights-of-way, and easements of record, if any; Motion Carried.

COMMUNITY WILDFIRE PROTECTION PLAN UPDATE: Megan Burke, Hydrologist RESPEC, was present to discuss fire planning in Wildland Urban Interface areas of the county, the Community Wildfire Protection Plan and Cooperating Agency status.

ZONING COMPLAINT/COIN: Zoning Complaint/Violation OWNER: Jamie Coin d.b.a. Canyon Concrete LEGAL: Tract C-R-1 of the SE 1/4 SE 1/4 in Section 5, T6N, R2E ZONING: SRD SUMMARY: Contractor Storage/Home Occupation. Jeff Schroeder, Deputy Code Enforcement Officer explained that several neighboring landowners had contacted the office to complain about the operation of a commercial business on the subject lot and also certain activities they have witnessed thereon. Schroeder then offered an overview of the Planning and Zoning Department's efforts to address the complaints since 2016, the date of first complaint. Schroeder noted that the subject property is zoned SR and that commercial activities are generally not an allowed use in the SR zoning district.

Jamie Coin, owner, was present and explained that prior to purchasing the subject lot, that he stored his concrete business equipment on a lot located at an industrial lot. Upon purchasing the subject lot, he then moved his equipment and vehicles to the subject lot. Further, he explained that he intends to build a home and a separate building to house his business equipment. Mr. Coin, stated that he has shored up financing to start the building process and that he hopes to commence construction soon.

Written complaints were received from Lyle Baumeister, Jeff & Mary Burket, Craig Mickelson, Bob Wilson and Bonnie Carr. Craig Mickelson-2015 Mineral Place, David Wilson-1930 Mica Drive and Mary Burket-1950 Mineral Place were present to discuss their specific concerns. Mickelson noted that neighboring landowner, Lyle Baumeister, previously requested permission from the county to store U-Hauls on his property, and was told that this was not the place to store them and that the appropriate location was in an industrial park. Mickelson opined that based on his long history as a member of the Lawrence County Planning and Zoning Commission, that the operation of a commercial business is not an allowed use in SRD, adding this is the second summer that people have been allowed to park on the property and sleep over night. Burket stated that her view from her deck was the subject property. She offered that it is commonplace to see men sleeping in vehicles parked on the subject property and relieving themselves. She has concern regarding the disposal of this human waste.

Commissioner Deibert commented that Coin has been given two requests in the past 18 months to move the forms and nothing has been done to date. He also added that Mr. Coin should follow the process for compliance as a home based business. Commissioner Johnson pointed out that Mr.

Coin has neighbors on all sides, and they have rights too. Commissioner Sleep commented that he felt that this type of business is probably not appropriate in this area.

Moved-Seconded (Deibert-Flanagan) to have all construction materials removed, to include rebar and forms within 30 days (June 21, 2018), and thereafter until Mr. Coin can come into compliance, if at all, with the requirements of a home based business. The motion also included that no employee parking shall be allowed and the number of trailers is limited to two with Skid-Steer loaded. Motion Carried. Commissioner Deibert offered that Mr. Coin is allowed to come again before the commission in the future to discuss the number of vehicles allowed on the property.

REQUEST TO OPEN SECTION LINE/GRAN: Heath Gran was present to discuss gaining access to his property. Gran stated he was working with the adjacent landowner regarding access. Moved-Seconded (Sleep-Deibert) to not object to the existing driveway being improved with the cooperation of neighboring landowners, and in compliance with City of Spearfish Development Agreement #24-16. Motion Carried.

BILLS:

Moved-Seconded (Deibert-Johnson) to approve payment of the following payroll and vouchers listed below for expenditures for insurance, professional services, publications, rentals, supplies, repairs, maintenance, travel, conference fees, utilities, furniture and equipment drawn on the proper funds and various departments.
