LONGEVITY PAY: Longevity pay will be awarded to permanent employees who have been employed for a minimum of five (5) years. Eligibility takes place on anniversary date of 5th year of employment, with increases on the 10th year of employment, 15th year of employment, and 20th year of employment. Longevity pay schedule is as follows: 5 Years -2 cent per hour for each year of employment; 10 Years- 4 cents per hour for each year of employment; 15 Years-6 cents per hour for each year of employment; 20 Years-8 cents per hour for each year of employment. Elected Officials are eligible for longevity pay. Elected County Commissioners are not eligible for longevity pay. Seasonal employees working consecutive years are eligible for longevity pay.

PER DIEM: Sheriff Deputies-\$6.00 per day, for a maximum of 5 days a week. Correctional Officers-\$1.00 per each day physically worked.

LAWRENCE COUNTY RESOLUTION # 2017-05 AMENDMENT #15 LAWRENCE COUNTY PERSONNEL MANUAL: WHEREAS, the Lawrence County Commissioners have adopted the Lawrence County Personnel Manual to establish a fair system of personnel

administration; and **WHEREAS**, updates need to be made to the manual to ensure the fair and equitable system is updated; **THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that effective January 1, 2017 and upon favorable passage of this resolution and until otherwise revised, the following revision is hereby adopted for **ARTICLE XVIII. GENERAL INFORMATION** of the Lawrence County Personnel Manual. **18.3) HEALTH INSURANCE:** The County provides health insurance of which the County pays a percentage of the monthly premium as determined by the County Commission. The participating employee will pay the remaining portion of the premium through payroll deduction. A permanent employee must be employed at least thirty (30) hours a week to participate in this insurance. Insurance coverage is available, upon an employee's termination. The employee can continue the health insurance under the COBRA plan. Length of health insurance continuation is eighteen (18) months unless a qualifying event lengthens the entitlement. The employee is responsible to pay the full premium. (See appendix 5). **Retiree Participation:** Eligibility to participate in the County's health insurance plan is also extended to retirees and their dependents:

Criteria:

1. Be eligible for retirement in the South Dakota Retirement System (SDRS).
2. Be at least 50 years of age.
3. Have been an employee of Lawrence County for a minimum of 15 cumulative years, and have been eligible to participate in the County's health insurance plan during that period.
4. Be enrolled in the County's health insurance plan at time of retirement.
5. Have provided written notice of intent to continue health insurance coverage upon retirement at least 30 days prior to the last day of employment. Failure to provide written notice may disqualify the employee's participation.

Requirements, Limitations, and Termination:

1. The former employee is required to pay the full amount of the premium. The premium will be due on a schedule established by the health insurance provider, and the former employee is required to pay their premium by the cutoff date each month. The premium is paid each month in advance for the following month's coverage. Failure to pay the premium on time may disqualify the employee's participation.
2. If the former employee, spouse or dependent child is a participant under another group healthcare plan, this benefit will be secondary. If medical coverage is terminated for any reason, later application for enrollment shall not occur.
3. Eligible former employees are allowed to participate in the County's health insurance plan for a maximum of 15 years from the date they retired, or until the participating former employee becomes entitled to Medicare, or until any other terminating event, whichever occurs first. At that time, they will be automatically removed from the plan.
4. Spouses and dependent children of former employees are also allowed to participate in the County's health insurance plan. Their participation may continue for a maximum of 15 years from the date the former employee retired, or until the former employee's death, or until the participating former employee becomes entitled to Medicare, or until Medicare eligibility (spouse) or until eligibility age limit is exceeded (dependent children), or until any other terminating event, whichever occurs first. At that time, they will be automatically removed from the plan.
5. A dependent spouse will become ineligible for coverage in the event of divorce from the former employee. However, dependent children may still be eligible for coverage provided they meet the aforementioned criteria.

6. If an employee retires less than 18 months before turning age 65, he/she would be offered COBRA coverage for 18 months and retiree coverage.
7. If the employee retires with more than 18 months of public body retiree coverage before reaching age 65 and elects retiree coverage, the retiree would not be eligible for COBRA coverage at age 65.
8. If a spouse and/or dependent was covered under public body retiree coverage and lost coverage within 18 months as a result of the retiree's attaining age 65 or the retiree's death, the spouse or dependent would be eligible for COBRA coverage for 36 months less the amount of time covered under the public body retiree coverage.
9. If a spouse or dependent was covered under public body retiree coverage and lost coverage more than 18 months later as a result of the retiree's attaining age 65 or the retiree's death, the spouse or dependent would not be eligible for COBRA but would be eligible for an extension of the retiree coverage for a maximum of 36 months from the date of the loss of retiree coverage due to either event.
10. The benefits will be the same for this group as active employees.

Commissioner Sleep feels the speed limit should remain at 45mph. Commissioner Flanagan stated that it would reduce the speed for the ingress and egress onto McGuigan Road. Allan Bonnema, Highway Superintendent, stated the speed limit should have never been moved to 45mph as the road was designed for 35mph. After discussion the motion was withdrawn by Johnson-Deibert.

SPEARFISH RURAL FIRE PROTECTION TAX DISTRICT: A public hearing was held on the proposed Spearfish Rural Fire Protection Tax District. Don Salazar, Spearfish, stated he was not opposed to the district but was concerned with who would provide apparatus and equipment. He also was concerned with dissolution of the taxing district and being doubled taxed if the property he owns would be annexed into the City of Spearfish. Gerald Draine stated that it is his opinion that contracting by the district with the City of Spearfish would be the best option since previously purchased fire equipment was already in its possession. Commissioner Flanagan stated that there are mechanisms to change the boundary. Commissioner Johnson stated that the City of Spearfish agreed to provide the outlying areas with fire protection for three years and felt this is very generous. Branden Ginter stated that the residents in the proposed district have donated money to the fire department over the years, some of which was used to

purchase equipment - including 5 fire trucks - of which the City has possession. He also questioned where the unspent donated money would go if the taxing district passes? Chairman Rosenau stated that the money would go to the fire district. Gerald Draine stated that the maximum mill levy is 1.60 per thousand: 1 mill for maintenance and .6 for equipment. Chairman Rosenau explained that the County does not set the mill levy for the district, but simply collects the tax and disperses same to the district. Charles Nicholas questioned where the money that is collected now for rural residents goes? Chairman Rosenau stated that it is divided among the fire departments on a pro rata basis. Bruce Outka, Deputy State's Attorney, stated that \$17,402 collected by a separate fire tax levy (applicable to residents of the County living outside municipalities) has historically been remitted to the City of Spearfish. Charles Nicholas asked what other equipment the County owns? Commissioner Johnson stated that the "Hawk" is the only piece of fire equipment owned by the County. No further public input was heard. The Public Hearing was closed.

Moved-Seconded (Flanagan-Deibert) to approve and authorize the Chairman to sign the following Order Of Initiation Of Organization Of Spearfish Rural Fire Protection District. Motion Carried.

Motion Carried.

CENTURY LINK: Moved-Seconded (Johnson-Flanagan) to follow the recommendation of Allan Bonnema, Highway Superintendent and approve the application for permit to occupy

county highway right-of-way for Centurylink located in Township 6N, Range 4E, Section 27 & 28 along the Crook City Rd. Motion Carried.

CENTURY LINK: Moved-Seconded (Johnson-Rosenau) to follow the recommendation of Allan Bonnema, Highway Superintendent and approve the application for permit to occupy county highway right-of-way for Centurylink located in Township 6N, Range 4E, Section 7 & 8 along the Acorn Ridge Rd. Motion Carried.

APPROACH PERMITS:

TOP SHELF DEVELOPMENT: Moved-Seconded (Johnson-Rosenau) to follow the recommendation of Allan Bonnema, Highway Superintendent and approve the application for approach permit for ETR, LLC on the west side of McGuigan Road located approximately 1,490' south of the intersection of HWY 14 & McGuigan Rd with the following Requirements and Special Conditions as set by Lawrence County: (1) Approach to be paved with asphalt within 6 months of completion. (2) Applicant agrees to install "No Truck Traffic" signs for trucks over 40' wheel base. (3) Applicant agrees to install a left turn lane on McGuigan Rd. (4) Applicant agrees to provide all traffic control signage during construction of approach and turning lane. Motion Carried.

Moved-Seconded (Johnson-Deibert) to follow the recommendation of Allan Bonnema, Highway Superintendent and approve the application for approach permit for ETR, LLC on the south side of Highway 14, located approximately 1,342' west of the intersection of HWY 14 & McGuigan Rd with the following Requirements and Special Conditions as set by Lawrence County: (1) Approach to be paved with asphalt to R.O.W. line within 6 months of completion. (2) Applicant agrees to install a left turn lane on West Hwy 14. (3) Applicant agrees to provide all traffic control signage during construction of approach and turning lane. Motion Carried.

GRIZZLY GULCH BRIDGE / REPLACEMENT: Moved-Seconded (Johnson-Deibert) to set a bid opening for April 11th, 2017 at 8:30 a.m. for the replacement of the Grizzly Gulch Bridge. Motion Carried.

CALAMITY GULCH LANE BRIDGE: Mike Kain was present to discuss his request for maintenance on the Calamity Gulch Lane Bridge. Kain stated he is trying to determine ownership of the bridge. Kain stated he took his documents to BangsMcCullen Law Firm and they determined that the County does own the bridge and the road. Discussion followed on a Quit Claim Easement vs Quit Claim Deed. Dana Bardsley, Forest Service was present to discuss ownership of the land. Bardsley agreed the Forest Service owns the land and fee, subject to the easement, and Homestake retained the mineral rights. Bardsley stated he doesn't believe the Forest Service owns the bridge. Kain stated the estimated cost to repair/replace the bridge is \$75,000 plus. Bruce Outka, County Attorney presented and reviewed documents as referenced in the below "Findings of Fact" Discussion followed on the possibility of the landowners forming a road district.

Moved-Seconded (Flanagan-Deibert) to follow the Findings of Fact, as listed below, and to make the final determination that the County does not own the Calamity Gulch Lane Bridge. The Forest Service owns the land and bridge, subject to the easement with the County having no obligation for road and bridge maintenance. Motion Carried.

Calamity Gulch Bridge / Findings of Fact

1. On, or about, December 11, 1991, Homestake Mining Company and Lawrence County entered into a Right-of-Way Easement agreement (Doc. #91-4541) granting the County easement for right-of-way for ingress and egress over certain parcels of land including the Calamity Gulch Road upon which the bridge is situated. The Agreement specifically provides that, “by accepting the benefit of the Easement, each user of the Easement and Lawrence County agree that Homestake shall have no responsibility, liability or obligation to build, construct, maintain, or repair any road, ditch, culvert, bridge, utility line or other improvement or structure whether now existing or subsequently constructed in or place upon the Easement. **Lawrence County’s acceptance of this easement on behalf of the public shall in no way obligate Lawrence County to build, construct, maintain or repair any road, ditch, culvert, bridge, utility line or other improvement or structure whether now existing or subsequently constructed in or place upon the easement.**”
2. On, or about December 16, 1991, the USFS and Lawrence County entered into a Public Road Easement agreement (Doc. #92-401).
3. By Quitclaim Deed dated January 24, 1992 (Doc. #92-416) Homestake Mining Company deeded certain parcels of land, including the land upon which the subject road and bridge are situated, to the USA. Lawrence County was not a party to this transfer.
4. At the December 18, 1991, county commission meeting, the minutes reflect that by accepting easements from both the United States and from Homestake that **“Lawrence County is not accepting any responsibility for road maintenance.”** (See meeting minutes that date.) **Further, that the aforementioned agreement between the county and Spearfish Canyon Homeowner’s Association provided that the Association “assumes all responsibility for road maintenance of those certain parcels.”** The agreement further provides that the county may, at its option, terminate the easements for access to homesites in the event SCOA fails to abide by its road/bridge maintenance obligations.
5. While County was granted an easement (See Doc. #91-4541 supra) any maintenance obligation for the road and bridge, etc were transferred by the County to and assumed by the **Spearfish Canyon Homeowners’ Association by agreement dated December 18, 1991. (See meeting minutes that date.)**
6. An Amended Land Exchange Agreement dated June 6, 1993 (Doc. #92-343 @ ¶ 10 also referencing a December 18, 1991 agreement) further explains the purpose of the County’s easements as providing “reasonable access to and from existing cabin sites over lands owned by Landowner on the date of Landowner’s execution of this agreement. (Homestake was “Owner” at date of execution)
7. Lawrence County has established a procedure for adding roads to the county highway system. This procedure provides as a condition precedent that any such roads be brought up to county specifications. Affected landowners have not requested that Calamity Gulch Road be added to the county highway system.

8. County has not approved any plats in the subject subdivision thereby creating lots serviced by the road/bridge; rather, the privately owned lots were pre-existing lots of record.

Conclusions of Law

1. SDCL 31-14-1 and SDCL 31-14-2 citing county obligation to maintain bridges excepting highways in townships is inapplicable as the subject bridge is situated on federal land over which the county has no jurisdiction.
2. **Four methods exist for establishing a public road (Matters v. Custer County, 538 N.W.2d 533 (SD 1995): 1.) Theory of prescriptive easement pursuant to SDCL 31-3-1 2.) Rural secondary highway pursuant to SDCL 31-3-6 through 9 3.) Section line highway under SDCL 31-18-1 4.) Establishment of public highway which was in effect prior to Statehood pursuant to SDCL 31-3-22 through 37. None of these methods are applicable according to the existing facts.**
3. **The road and bridge are not part of the County primary or secondary road system as defined in SDCL 31-1-1 and 31-12-26. Unless a road falls within the county's delegated area of responsibility, the county has no duty or responsibility to maintain a road or bridge.**
4. The County has never agreed to maintain the roads, bridges, etc as part of the easement agreements referenced herein so as to be responsible under SDCL 31-12-19.
5. Nowhere has the County designated the road or bridge at issue to be built as a highway within the meaning of SDCL 31-1-5.
6. **The County does not have any responsibility under SDCL 31-12-26, unless and until the road in question is designated as a secondary highway under SDCL 31-3-22 through 31-3-37.**
7. SDCL 11-3-12 provides in part that, ". . . no governing body shall be required to open, improve, or maintain any such dedicated streets, alleys, ways, commons, or other public ground simply by virtue of having approved a plat or *having partially accepted any such dedication, donation or grant.* For purposes of SDCL 11-3-12, the easement from Homestake is a donation or grant regarding which the county assumed to duty to improve or maintain the road or bridge.
8. **SDCL 31-13-12 provides: The board of county commissioners of each county is hereby empowered to designate *in its discretion* township roads or roads in unorganized townships within the county, as it may deem advisable and in the public interest as "county aid roads, " and to expend any funds available from the county highway funds for laying out, constructing, graveling, and maintaining such township roads or roads in unorganized townships so designated as "county aid roads." (Emphasis added). The county has never designated the subject road as a "county aid road" for which the county may expend county highway funds.**
9. The County's role and obligation pursuant to the foregoing agreements was limited to facilitating access to existing cabin sites.

VACATION OF HIGHWAY / SECTION LINE / KINSHIP MOUNTAIN MINISTRIES:

A public hearing was held on petitions received to vacate a portion of a highway, part of which is located on a section line. Connie Williams and Dave Winter spoke in support of the vacation of section line.

Moved-Seconded (Flanagan-Deibert) to approve and authorize the Chairman to sign the following Lawrence County Resolution #2017-07 Resolution & Order To Vacate A Portion Of A Highway, Part Of Which Is Located On A Section Line. Motion Carried.

LAWRENCE COUNTY RESOLUTION #2017-07 RESOLUTION & ORDER TO VACATE

A PORTION OF A HIGHWAY, PART OF WHICH IS LOCATED ON A SECTION

LINE: WHEREAS, a petition was presented to the Board of County Commissioners of Lawrence County, South Dakota, signed by at least one percent of the ballots cast for the last gubernatorial election in Lawrence County, requesting that a portion of a highway, part of which is located on a section line be vacated, **WHEREAS**, the Board of County Commissioners set a date for hearing and evidence having been presented to the Board of County Commissioners that notice has been given of the time, place and purpose of said hearing by publication of notice in the B.H. LEAD ANNEXATION / KIRK ROAD: Dennis Schumacher, Lead Zoning Administrator was present to review a proposed Lead Annexation including a portion of Kirk Road that is maintained by the County. The Board stated the County will retain the division authority because the County is the Highway Authority. Moved-Seconded (Flanagan-Deibert) to not object to the annexation because there is no adverse affects on the County road. Motion Carried.

Commissioner Deibert left the meeting.

CHANGE OF ZONING (COZ) #316 / JEFF AND POLLY GARRETT: A Public Hearing and First Reading was held on the proposed COZ #316 Applicants: Jeff and Polly Garrett. SUMMARY: Request to Change Zoning from A-1 Ag to A-2 Residential Ag. LEGAL: Tract G located in the E1/2 SE1/4 of Section 28 and the SW ¼ of Section 27, T7N, R2E. No public input was voiced and the public hearing was closed. Second Reading was scheduled for May 9, 2017.

Amber Vogt, Planning and Zoning Director presented history on the Community Improvement District and the Letter of Credit on file. Vogt also checked to see if any advertising was being done and, if so, landowners were told they had to remove the ads or apply for a C.U.P. The state was also contacted regarding this issue and the State advised it too has no regulations prohibiting this type of activity.

ITEMS FROM THE PUBLIC: Donnie Quaschnick and Lynnette Quaschnick were present to discuss increased ATV traffic in the Custer Peak area. The pair stated that speeding vehicles and dust are a problem. Johnson stated that increased ATV traffic is noticeable on the paved roads, too. Deibert stated that the area experienced the same problem 20 years ago with snowmobiles.

Chairman Randall Rosenau called the regular meeting of the Lawrence County Commissioners to order and the Pledge of Allegiance was conducted at 8:00 a.m. on October 10, 2017 in the Administrative Annex Building of the Lawrence County Courthouse located at 90 Sherman Street, Deadwood, SD with Commissioners Brandon Flanagan, Daryl Johnson, Richard Sleep, and Randy Deibert present.

All motions were passed by unanimous vote, by all members present, unless stated otherwise.

AGENDA: Moved-Seconded (Flanagan-Johnson) to approve the agenda as amended. Motion Carried.

DECLARE CONFLICTS: No conflicts were declared by the Lawrence County Commission.

MINUTES: Moved-Seconded (Flanagan-Sleep) to approve the minutes of September 26th County Commission meeting and Board of Adjustment Meeting. Motion Carried.

PERSONNEL:

CITY OF SPEARFISH: Moved-Seconded (Sleep-Deibert) to approve the abatement, contingent upon the approval from the City of Spearfish, for the City of Spearfish on parcel #32315-00800-340-00 because the property is now tax exempt. Motion Carried.

SHERIFF:

COURTHOUSE SECURITY PROJECT UPDATE: The following bids were received for the Courthouse Security Project Update: Ainsworth-Benning Construction - \$67,800.00; Donovan Construction - \$77,813.00.

Moved-Seconded (Flanagan-Johnson) to follow the recommendation of Steve Williams, Williams & Associates and accept the lowest responsible bid and waive any irregularities from Ainsworth-Benning Construction in the amount of \$67,800.00 and allow the Chairman to sign the contracts. Motion Carried.

HIGHWAY:

5 YEAR HIGHWAY IMPROVEMENT PLAN: A public meeting was held on the 5 year Highway Improvement Plan. Allan Bonnema, Highway Superintendent asked everyone in attendance to please sign in. Bonnema noted that comments would be accepted either orally or in written form. Comments received will be sent to the state along with the 5 Year Plan. Bonnema reviewed the 2018-2022 Highway Improvement Plan noting some changes from the draft plan discussed at a previous Commission meeting. Commissioner Sleep stated that the County needs to gravel more roads each year noting that there are a lot of bad roads and specifically that there are portions of some roads where vehicles and equipment can get bogged down in mud. Bonnema addressed this comment, offering that there is oftentimes variability in the quality of the gravel available.

A number of residents were present to advocate for the paving of the Maitland Road and insure inclusion of the project as part of the 5 year Plan. Jane Lockwood asked if letters and comments previously submitted to the Commission regarding paving the Maitland Road will be submitted as part of the 5 year Plan? Commissioner Flanagan addressed this question, clarifying that the current discussion was in regard to the 5 year Plan, and not specifically the Maitland Road paving project. Commissioner Johnson explained a 5 year Plan was not required by the State in the past, but is now a condition for eligibility for state funding. Johnson added that it is very important that the County follow the established guidelines. Johnson further noted that public comments from the past, regarding issues like paving the Maitland Road, are nonetheless very important. Commissioner Deibert also noted that the County has received letters in the past regarding the Maitland Road and reassured those present that this information is recorded in Commission minutes and/or maintained in County records. Deibert clarified that the current discussion was regarding the state grant program for bridges noting that the 5 year Plan is just that: a plan; and, that like any plan, it is subject to change for many reasons. These reasons may include available funding, a change in need, and a different Board of Commissioners.

Commissioner Johnson explained that while many cringed when the Commission adopted the wheel tax, it was nonetheless an eligibility requirement of the bridge replacement program. Bonnema stated that the County must submit a 5 year Plan by October 15, 2017.

Jane Lockwood stated that Maitland Road is the most traveled gravel road in the County. Glen Davis questioned how the County determines what roads get priority? Bonnema explained that he considers traffic volume and whether a given road is either a primary road or secondary road.

Bonnema further explained that paved roads are given a higher maintenance priority versus gravel roads in order to maintain the improvements. Bonnema also offered that another important consideration in formulating a plan is the availability of funding. Commissioner Deibert stated that the territory of the County includes a large amount of public lands, and once a federal road is paved under a federal contract, then the County is required to maintain the road. Addressing paving of the Maitland Road, Commissioner Sleep pointed out that he has spoken with a number of residents opposed to paving the Maitland Road. Sleep noted that safety is a concern, and that a paved road is not necessarily safer than a gravel road. Sleep explained that drivers on a paved road with a painted center-line do not always stay within their lane. Terry Pelkola asked if driving down the middle of the gravel road was safer? Bonnema stated that Maitland Road is safe if the speed limit is followed. Tom Martz stated that he drives Maitland on a daily basis and recently had to dodge a pickup to avoid a collision. Martz explained that if the Maitland Road were paved, it would at least have a center line for drivers to obey. Dave Lockwood stated that he was at the Commission meeting 13 months ago and gave a presentation for the group regarding paving the Maitland Road adding that he likes the proposed Plan. Lockwood stated that the Maitland Road is the busiest gravel road in Lawrence County. He continued stating that the road causes rust to vehicles, and that safety is a concern due to no center line. Finally he added that the City of Spearfish and Lawrence County are currently working cooperatively towards paving the road and that he did not want to lose that momentum: it is time. Ross Rabenberg stated that a paved road with a painted centerline would make a huge difference, explaining that he was surprised that there had not been a head on collision. Kurt Kjelland stated that while his kids wait for the school bus the vehicles come around the corner and have to deviate to miss the school bus. Jeff Miller observed that he spends a lot of time in his yard and the people who live along the Maitland Road do adhere to the posted speed limit, adding that it is non-residents who speed. He also wondered if Lawrence County would be responsible in the event of an accident. Tom Martz stated he was quite impressed with the new gravel that was applied to the road in the last month, but that the condition of the road has already changed. He noted that the rock is gone and the slime is back. He further noted that there is 160 acres of land that is going to be developed in the near future, and that traffic will double in the next 10 years. He expressed his opinion that the County ought to do the right thing and pave the road. Chairman Rosenau pointed out that the County must coordinate all such efforts with the City of Spearfish. Harlan Horst stated that Maitland is a primary road and has a lot of traffic. Commissioner Flanagan thanked Allan Bonnema for his work on the Plan and also to all those who attended and their input.

Moved-Seconded (Flanagan-Deibert) to approve the 5 year highway Plan and authorize the Chairman to sign the certification. Motion Carried.

CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT #435/EDWARDS, CHARLES :

HAUL ROAD AGREEMENT: Ken Barker, attorney for Charles Edwards, was present to give an update on the proposed Haul Road Agreement and asked for more time to review same with Bruce Outka, Deputy State's Attorney, with the expectation that a revised draft will be presented to the Commission on October 24, 2017. He mentioned the MOU may need some adjustment as his client has concern about being assigned undue maintenance responsibility for the haul route roads and the language allowing the County to alter the designated haul route without notice.

Commissioner Deibert is concerned about how to determine who is creating the damage and how to charge this back to the applicant accordingly. Deibert also wanted to clarify this should be an agreement not an MOU. He also wondered if Datum Creek Place Road should be looked at differently than the rest of the route. Commissioner Flanagan clarified with attorney Barker that he (Barker) was asking for more time to review the document. Commissioner Johnson expressed concern with the amount of time it has taken to get this far and questioned why Mr. Edwards and Mr. Barker have not made time to review the document prior to the meeting. Commissioner Sleep interjected that he would like the Commission to conduct an on-site visit to more precisely determine what damage has been done by the haul trucks, and what damage can be expected in the future in an effort to fairly quantify and apportion the responsibility between the County and the permit holder for road maintenance.

Dan Adams was present and questioned who would be liable if there were to be an accident along the haul route? He also questioned the size of the gravel pit; the location of the sign giving notice to residents of public hearings held in conjunction with approval of the CUP, and the CUP process in general. Finally, he noted his concerns about road stability. Gayle Schuster expressed her concern with the noise caused by crushing and loading of trucks. She also expressed concerns regarding notice given to neighboring landowners during the approval process, and the truck traffic.

The Commission requested that Outka & Barker have a final draft of the Haul Road Agreement by October 24, 2017. This item is scheduled Tuesday, October 24, 2017 at 8:30 a.m.

DUST COMPLAINT: Vogt presented the complaint to the Commission. Commissioner Flanagan explained that he was the one who filed the complaint. The Commission viewed photos and videos submitted on Friday, September 29, 2017 to the P & Z office. The applicant was questioned about what was going to be done to mitigate dust. Eric Hoffman, Western Construction, said they were currently removing the crushing machinery and would be wrapping up for this season. Flanagan stated they needed to have a Dust Control Plan prior to operation beginning again. Johnson said the stockpiles needed to be included in the plan.

Moved-Seconded (Flanagan - Johnson) to require a dust control plan for stock piles; crushing and traffic by the November 14, 2017, County Commission meeting. Motion Carried.

MCGUIGAN ROAD & HWY 14A TURNING LANES: Nick Hoffman, Interstate Engineering and David Rossi, Top Shelf developer, were present to answer question on the McGuigan Road & HWY 14A turning lanes.

HWY 14A RIGHT OF WAY ENCROACHMENTS: Discussion was held on the Hwy 14A right-of-way encroachments. Commissioner Sleep expressed his concern for safety of vehicles exiting the Guadalajara's Restaurant parking lot onto Hwy 14A. Commissioner Deibert stated that he is concerned with the process, and that the County needs a process to get affected businesses engaged in the conversation. Commissioner Flanagan asked Amber Vogt, Planning & Zoning Administrator to look into a permit process for occupation of the right-of-way.

MOTOR GRADER WARRANTY: Discussion was held on the extended warranty on the 6 motor graders. The warranty will expire on October 17, 2017. Moved-Seconded (Flanagan-Sleep) to purchase a 1 year power train & hydraulic system warranty including parts and labor. Motion Carried.
